THE PATCH PS WINS

"BIODIVERSITY SCHOOL OF THE YEAR"

On Friday, November 11, our Grade 4 students Logan, Darcy, Ruby, Gracie and Ted represented The Patch Primary School at the annual ResourceSmart School Awards in the city. Here is what they had to say about it.

<u>Ruby:</u> Our school entered three competitions which were "Waste School of the Year", "Biodiversity School of the Year" and "Student-Led Action Team of the Year".

We were finalist for two awards and won the "Biodiversity School of the Year" award for 2016.

Biodiversity means having lots of different varieties of living things and we won because:

- We have planted over 2,000 indigenous plants on our school ground
- Our plantings have attracted lots of wildlife and increased biodiversity
- We have regular working bees to care for our plantings, and
- We are committed to constantly improving our biodiversity.

This is the award we were given and this is the book that shows all the winners.

<u>Gracie:</u> On Friday most of us woke up at 6.30 in the morning, got dressed in our school uniform and left for the Belgrave Railway station. We wanted to catch public transport into the city because it is more sustainable. First we went by bus, then train and finally tram to the Melbourne Museum where the ceremony was held. Ella rode her bike and met us at the museum. It took us two hours to get there and nearly three hours to get home again but it was fun and educational. Thanks Ella for coming along.

<u>Darcy:</u> The ceremony started at 9.45 and our hosts' names were Natalie Hunter from a show called "Totally Wild" and Josh Earl who is a comedian on a children's show. The awards encourage schools to take actions that improve sustainability in their schools and focus on water use, reducing waste, saving energy and improving biodiversity. We listened to some very important people talking about how we can work together to make the world a better place.

<u>Ted:</u> We joined the Dinosaur Group for some museum workshops and learnt about how animals are prepared for display in the museum. We saw stick insects and stuffed wildlife and also visited a few of the museum displays. I loved seeing all the exhibits and learning about the origin of the Earth. My mum also came along and helped on the day which was great.

<u>Logan:</u> After we had finished our workshops, we had some free time in the museum so we visited the Forest Gallery. In this gallery we took notes so we can improve the swamp, fern gully and school grounds. One idea is to make a waterfall with rocks in the fern gully.

I found a blotched blue tongue lizard and a new type of fern call the Ray Fern.

It was a really great day and we learnt a lot.

A reminder for the commencement of Term 1 2017

– We are identified as being at higher risk on the Bushfire register and, as such, will be required to pre-emptively close on days of Code Red Day fire danger. More information will be available next year.
