### A reminder for the commencement of Term 1 2017

We are identified as being at higher risk on the Bushfire register and, as such, will be required to pre-emptively close on days of Code Red Day fire danger. More information will be available next year.

On days of Total fire ban all children will be required to be picked up from drop off and no children will be permitted to walk home or leave the school without an adult.

#### ANNOUNCEMENT TO SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Every two years our school is offered a limited number of places at the Department of Education and Training's Somers School Camp – Woorabinda over 5 days for children in Years 4 & 5.

This year our allocated time is **13/03/2017 – 17/03/2017**. It is a five day commitment and as such I would ask that you <u>only</u> fill in the expression of interest form, if your child can attend without concerns of sports or family commitments.

Children who gain selection from our school will join with other Year 4 and 5 children from our school network in this very special Outdoor and Environmental Education and Personal Development program.

The camp has both indoor and outdoor activities all run by specialist permanent teaching staff with the assistance of five local teachers who will accompany the children to and from the camp – this may also include one of our own teaching staff.

The activities are mainly physical and outdoor and include High and Low Ropes Courses, Canoeing, Initiative Activities which require a reasonable level of physical fitness. All children are also required to take part in the following activities: Archery, Art, Environmental Studies, Bush Cooking, Mapping, Flying Fox, Disco Night, Camp Fire Night Singing and Diary Writing. Separate boys and girls living arrangements are provided but all activities are done in mixed groups.

The fee for the camp is \$190 and must be paid in full before children can attend. The fee includes transport, accommodation and meals.

This is a great experience and provides children with the opportunity to accept challenges, improve their self-esteem, meet and mix with other children from our local area, have fun and learn at the same time.

If you would like your Grade 4 or 5 child to attend please fill in the expression of interest form below and return it by December 20.

Names will be selected at random however consideration of behaviour and social skills must be taken into account.


# Christmas Hamper Appeal

### Information for Parents:

Hello everyone, my name is Cath Russell and I am a parent of the The Patch School, a local professional musician & registered music therapist (RMT).

I'm working on a fantastic project for next year and I'm looking to get Patch kids & families involved, because the project is closely aligned with The Patch Primary's environment & sustainability focus.

Info regarding the project follows:

#### Overview & Rationale:

- Plastic Bag Free Dandenong Ranges (PBFDR) is a local group seeking to educate the local community about the benefits of using recyclable bags. PBFDR runs educational forums at community centres and schools on the benefits to our local environment, including our local waterways and local platypus population, when recyclable bags are used
- PBFDR has been auspiced by Southern Dandenong Ranges Landcare, and has been successful in receiving funding from the Shire of Yarra Ranges to create a flashmob aimed at raising community awareness about options to plastic bags
- Cath Russell has been employed by PFRDR & Southern Dandenongs Landcare to facilitate and direct a flashmob, working with children singing 'Carry Better Bags'
- PBFDR has created 'Boomerang Bags' as an alternative to plastic bags and is ready to make these available at the local IGA in Upwey
- The local IGA management has agreed to allow us to flashmob, to raise awareness about the alternatives to plastic bags when shopping in the community. This is not a commercial endorsement of a business but we are appreciative that the store are willing for the event to take place there.

Proposed Date: Sat 25th March, approx midday

Venue: IGA Upwey

#### Proposed activities:

- primary school children at local primary schools taught 'Carry Better Bags' song during school hours
- families of children at these schools will be notified of the proposed flashmob at IGA and invited to attend a rehearsal
- rehearsal will take place at local hall (venue tba) Friday 24th March
- Participating families will make their own way to the IGA for the performance Sat 25th March
- all children will be accompanied by parents or guardians and participate with family members present
- PBFDR will be filming and recording the performance to create a short video of the flashmob for sharing on social media
- PBFDR will be notifying local press of the event
- Kids who would like to be involved will need to have an adult accompanying them to the rehearsal & to the IGA. Our hope is that once students have had contact with PBFDR through school, some of them will want to participate in the performance as well.

More information shall be provided next year; looking forward to hearing from as many interested participants as possible.


