#### **BIODIVERSITY AT THE PATCH PRIMARY SCHOOL**

#### <u>A little story</u>

The Patch Primary School was awarded the ResourceSmart Biodiversity School of the Year in 2016 and 2014 in recognition of the actions taken to improve and protect habitat for wildlife on the school grounds. Last year, the year 4 students undertook a STEM project to construct suitable attachments to enable 15 nesting boxes designed for a range of native wildlife, to be installed in several large trees in our school ground.

During the summer holidays, our arborist Harry, a past student of The Patch, offered to install the boxes without cost as he was keen to help us with this worthwhile project. Harry, an enthusiastic climber and keen conservationist, was busy installing a large greater glider nesting box in the Eagle Tree between the year 4 classroom and the Japanese room when a small sugar glider appeared from the bark and leaves gathered in the fork of the tree. Before long, seven sugar gliders appeared from the same site, disturbed by Harry's actions, and scampered along some of the large branches of the Eucalyptus tree. This tree, a huge Manna Gum, is only 35 years old, and is home to lots of animals as we are discovering.

Year 4 STEM classes this year are using the Sugar Glider colony as a springboard to gain a greater understanding of the wildlife in and around our school, how our school habitat supports these animals and how we all connect in this complex and beautiful ecosystem.

#### Our Chicken Monitors are really Chicken Whisperers!

When our new chickens arrived at school this year, no-one thought they would be able to be handled for some time. They were flighty, nervous and unused to being picked up and cuddled. It was decided that if they didn't suit our school life, we may have to arrange for some replacements so our children could learn through contact and responsibility the role of caring for chickens. Quite amazingly, our three chicken monitors (read "whisperers"), Gracie, Ford and Emily, took less than one week to have the chickens firmly in their powers! It is a common sight to see these three year five students carrying their charges around the garden and giving them opportunities for a "green pick" with no fear of them

running away. What an incredible effort!

- Clean up garden near hall and kinder
- Oil outside picnic tables and bench seats
- Remove dead wood from identified trees
- Gather willow prunings and place in green waste skip
- Spread sawdust on paths
- Mulch garden beds
- Weed (just about anywhere)
- Trim box hedge with wave pattern
- Take hard garbage to roadside for pickup on March 6
- Cut down Kangaroo Apple tree near playground
- Clean up Dry Garden and plunge succulent cuttings
- Remove weeds from paths in vegetable garden
- Summer prune apple espalier and selected fruit trees
- Move wood supply for pizza oven from behind eco-centre to pizza oven pile
- Move donated work bench to back of eco-centre STEM Maker Space
- Cut back and dig up blackberries along 5/6 breezeway
- Clean mosaic pavers around pizza garden
- Weed pizza garden and prepare for new plantings of herbs
- Lightly prune olive and cumquat trees
- Seal along wall and concrete slab in eco-centre at verandah to prevent continual flooding
- Rake paths and weed in fern gully

#### 40Km/h Speed Zone

A reminder for everyone to please slow down and be extremely observant in and around school zones, school parking zones and in particular school crossings.

The school zones of 40km per hour speed limits are enforced from 8am to 9.30am in the morning and 2.30pm to 4pm in the afternoon but even outside of those time motorists should slow down and take extra care around schools.



#### Help with Reading Needed

Reading and writing skills are crucial for our children. They are not natural skills but need to be taught and reinforced. While all children develop reading and writing skills at different rates, for some children extra support is required – for some, this extra support will be needed throughout their primary schooling year.

We are seeking the help of parents/grandparents/others who can regularly donate at least 1 ½ hours once a week for two terms. This will enable us to set up a reading support program (initially for grade 2/3 students needing extra support). The program will run from 9.10 to 10.40am each day. If successful, a similar program will be extended to grade 1 later in the year. The program is based on the Corrective Reading program which uses direct instruction. Volunteers will be trained in how to run the program and will then work with 2-3 students. If you can help out, either as a regular volunteer, or a replacement volunteer on days when someone is unable to come, or you just want to find out more, please fill in the attached form.

# **Preparing for the Risk of Bushfire**

I'm sure you are all very aware of the increased risk of bushfire we face by living in such a beautiful, forested environment. Whilst there will always be a risk here, there are many things we can do to make us as safe as possible.

At school, our Emergency Management Plan provides a detailed procedure to deal with fire in our immediate area and we also have processes that ensure we are ready to respond on days when the fire danger is significant.

On days of Total Fire Ban, we:

- Limit the area students can play in the school grounds to enable us to gather them quickly if necessary
- Prepare the Hall, roll down the metal shutters
- Ask students to keep shoes on inside in case we need to re-locate
- Use a 'book mark' system when students leave the classroom and they must go in pairs
- Monitor the VicEmergency website and CFA radio traffic
- Ensure all students are collected by an adult after school (unless written parental consent is provided)

In the event of bushfire in the immediate area, we want to reassure you that your children will be cared for and kept as safe as possible and, although it will be difficult, we ask that you resist driving straight to school to collect your child. In emergency conditions, you are likely to be anxious and possibly panicked, which can increase your own risk of having an accident on the way to school. This will only add to the distress on the day. Secondly, if the air is smokey, opening the Hall's roller shutters for you to enter will compromise the air quality inside and make conditions even more uncomfortable for students and staff.

We will keep you informed as the situation unfolds and advise you as soon as it is safe to come to school and pick up your children. Please be sure to check in with your child's teacher and sign your child out before taking them as it is vital that we know that every student has been released into the care of an adult.

Emergencies such as bushfire are made more difficult by being unprepared. Staff at The Patch School spend a great deal of time preparing for fire and other situations so please know that our students' safety is paramount and we will do all we can to preserve that, regardless of what comes our way.

Note that Deb has mentioned in this newsletter that the Department of Education & Training has recently announced that schools on the *Bushfire At Risk Register* in the 'upper cohort' **will close on days of Extreme fire danger as well as Code Red days**. This includes The Patch School.

It is also important for *your* family to have a bushfire survival plan and that you:

- Understand and practice your plan
- Know what the trigger is to enact your plan
- Let your extended family and friends know what you plan to do

If your plan involves leaving the area on days of significant fire danger, remember that absence from school under these circumstances is acceptable and approved by the Principal.

If you have any questions about how we manage bushfire risk or any other emergency, please don't hesitate to contact the school.
