

# A wonderful start!

We have had a great start to Term 2! The children have settled back into the routines of school with ease, it is amazing how much they learn and grow in one term. This week will be exhausting for them as they head into their first full week of school. (3) While we have a very detailed curriculum plan for our week, we also gage where the children are at and how they are coping and adjust our week accordingly. I would like to thank Elke for keeping the ball rolling in Prep B and ensuring the children had the same routines as always.

# **ANZAC Day**

As you know last week was ANZAC day. We had a special assembly on the Friday to acknowledge this. In the Prep room we also acknowledged the day by reading My Grandad Marches on ANZAC day. We did omit one page that we felt was a bit beyond the Preps. The message for the children was that the day was to acknowledge those people that help to keep Australia safe and a symbol of that is the poppy. We did some lovely poppy paintings using balloons and paint brushes. (see end of newsletter for photos).



#### Numeracy-Term Two

- 100 days of school- during this time we explore numbers to 100 and place value.
- Pattern- children are exploring pattern from simple patterns to more complicated patterns. This will then link to number patterns.
- Numbers to 20- Children are practicing one-to-one correspondence and counting skills. We explore everything to do with our number of the day, from adding ten or 100 to our number, what comes before and after, number facts, tallying, tens frames, number lines and correctly forming the written number and exploring the word and the sounds within it. This week. Our next number of the day is 16.

#### **Literacy**

#### Writing

#### Writing

- Children are at varying stages of their writing development, as such we teach to the point of need of each stage.
  Some children are practising the 'mechanics' of writing. Writing in the correct direction, using the correct pencil grip, what lines to write on etc..
- Some children are practising sounding out any letters they can hear in the word they are writing.
- Some children use 'clues' to help them write some of our sight words such as the Golden words in the room.
- Some children are focusing on th, sh, ch ing etc and commonly used words.
- We are focusing on adding a full stop to the end of our sentences, exclamation marks and capital letters.
- Children are all practising the correct formation of letters also.

## **Levelled Books**

We change our levelled books on a Monday, please have them in your child's **<u>BLUE folder</u>**. Unfortunately, we don't have enough levelled books to keep sending home if the previous ones are not returned. We also change our library books on a Monday. This week we let children borrow regardless of if they had returned their book or not as we have missed library these past few weeks. Next Monday however children must have returned their books to be able to borrow another one.

## A bit more about Literacy...

**Name of the Day-** We use the children's names to learn the letters and sounds. We find this approach works much better than learning one sound/letter a week. Children compare and look at similarities in their own names to the 'name of the day'. We do a letter dance identifying the position the letter sits on the line when writing and we do a chant to help remember the names of the letters. We also get other members of the grade to say nice things about that person that we record and add to their memory box and 'friend' book.

Letter of the Day- While focusing on letter/sounds in EVERYTHING we do throughout the day we also focus on one letter of the day (usually 2 a week). We are currently up to Hh. We practise writing and forming the letter using many different forms such as playdough, white boards, rice, chalk and paper and pencil. We usually link this to a craft activity to help develop fine motor skills, such as using scissors etc.. We brainstorm words we know that start with the letter and look at different words and how the letter is used.

<u>Small Group work –</u> While children are working on different tasks we also run focused teacher lead groups. This may be to consolidate work already covered or to extend those that need to be challenged more. This way we can help children learn from their point of need.

# What can you do at home to help with literacy?

At home there are many things you can be doing to help your child on their learning journey.

**Letter/sound practice** – help your child learn their letter sounds by asking them the initial sound they can hear in a word. Show them what the letter looks like and get them to draw a picture related to the sound.

<u>M100W</u> Look for the words in books or when you are out on signs etc. Have them placed around the house on sticky notes so children see them often and you can ask them what they are (you could do this for letters and numbers too).

<u>Writing</u> Get children to write cards or letters to friends or family. Encourage them to write down any sounds they can hear in a word. Let them help with the shopping list!

Don't forget you have Reading Eggs and Mathletics to help your child learn also!

# What we are learning

#### Reading

- We are focusing on decoding strategies. So far children have used Eagle Eye and Lips the fish. to help them decode the text they are trying to read.
- Some children are still working on letter/sounds.
- Some are focusing on sight words and recognizing them in text.

#### **STEM**

- How can be interact with them safely?

#### PE
