What we are learning......

Literacy

After the great success of our history projects, during Term 3 we are stepping back into our open-ended writer's workshop. Children get to choose what they write about, including genre e.g. narrative, procedural or non-fiction texts. Students are also participating in weekly focused spelling, grammar and punctuation sessions with Judy on a Friday. - Pauleen

Numeracy

During the first half of Term 3, our students have been working hard on gaining a deeper understandings of fractions.

This is often an area of confusion for many Year 3/4 students. However the lessons and activities are showing that most students can now order simple fractions from smallest to largest, split groups of objects into equal groups and many now investigating mixed and improper fractions. Learning about fractions demands persistence and an inquiring mind and we are very proud of the way our Patch students are sticking to it and working with focus and determination. - Andrew

S.T.E.M

This term in S.T.E.M we are focusing on Physical Science, in particular forces. We will investigate how different forces effect the movement of objects. Students will be introduced to the topic of friction and reminded of the force of Gravity on the world around us. - Nina

Philosophy

In Philosophy this term we are reviewing the information received in our grade 4-6 student survey. <u>Japanese</u>

This term the Grade 3/4s are studying a traditional Japanese folk tale, The Mouses Marriage. It is a humorous tale where a mouses parents look to the elements to find the mightiest partner for their daughter. This unit will increase the student's receptive and productive use of Japanese; develop their understandings of literacy and the use of comprehension strategies to gain meaning from text; as well as exploring the celebration of weddings from an intercultural and historic perspective. – Jess B

Music

We have begun to explore songs and percussion items from around the world that we will sing together at The Patch Fest. Students have been creating actions for 'Shake the Papaya Down', a fun West Indian song, and exploring body percussion, drumming and Marimba parts for Funga Alafia from West Africa. We are also learning Lingmarra, an Indigenous song from Arnhem Land which translates as 'Let us All come together'.

Many grade $\frac{3}{4}$ students are participating in choir on Thursday afternoons. I have asked students who are in choir now to commit for the rest of the year. - Leanne

Terracycle Update:

Our school is currently involved in three Terracycle programs:

1) Colgate oral care products

Any brand of toothbrushes, empty toothpaste tubes, floss containers, mouthwash containers.

Please note - bamboo tooth brushes should not be included in the program. With these, remove the bristles at home (place in landfill) and then reuse or compost the stick

2) Bread bag tags

As the name says, hard plastic bag clips, as you would normally find on a bread bag.

3) Dish and air care products:

Any brand of dish care and air care packaging, including:

- Dishwashing liquid bottles (including caps)
- Dishwashing tablets flexible packaging (including snap locks and zip locks)
- Air freshener aerosol cans and spray bottles (including spray and trigger heads)
- Plug-in air fresheners and refills (including plastic outer packaging)
- Clip-on car fresheners and refills (including plastic outer packaging)

The Terracycle collection bins are located outside the old uniform shop, near Tania's prep classroom. Please place bag tags inside the plastic bag in the labelled bin.
