

A Reminder for Voluntary Curriculum Contributions

Education for all children, no matter their circumstances, is an essential good that we are lucky to access in Australia. As a state school, our buildings and teachers are funded by the Department of Education to ensure that our children have the opportunity to grow and learn to their full potential. Beyond this, the school covers additional expenses primarily through voluntary curriculum contributions and other fundraising.

Our curriculum contributions, although voluntary, provide assistance with the purchase of essentials such as paper, pencils, books, crafts so that all children can fully participate in school life regardless of their circumstances.

Unfortunately, our curriculum contributions are well down on previous years. This jeopardises the school's ability to cover additional expenses and places more pressure on fundraising.

We realise that times are incredibly difficult for ALL families, every aspect of our lives is currently affected by rising costs and our school is not immune to this. If you are in a position to pay the full amount, here is a gentle reminder.

If you would like to pay a different amount or weekly, monthly payments, simply go to QKR and as shown above "Enter Amount". You can do this as many times as you like over the school year. It is similar to a payment plan.

If you need additional advice or assistance, the voluntary curriculum contributions are overseen by our Business manager Karen. She is welcoming, understanding and discreet, and will happily help you in any way she can (we are lucky to have her!).

We understand that not everyone can afford to pay especially in the current climate, but we are grateful for anyone who can pay whatever the amount.

FILL THEIR BASKET



Soon we will begin the process of choosing our next school principal



Discussions have been had with not only the school council and staff but also with the SRC and students to ensure that everyone has a voice.

The school has a Facebook page run by the staff


