FROM THE PRINCIPAL...

Thought for the week: Have you got your fire plan ready?

Fire Safety at this time of the year and in Term one is always on our minds. in case of an emergency we will relocate to the hall or the oval depending on the identified risk. We have had a strong plan and process for many years now. Thanks to Glenn and Ken who have prepared the area surrounded the hall to meet compliance.

Parent Payment Charges for 2021 have been emailed to you, there are several pages of information as we implement the Department of Education guidelines. These documents can also be found on our website and are available in hardcopy at the office.

As the year draws quickly to a conclusion, we reflect on the year and look forward to a smooth transition into 2021. This year we have had our Strategic Review which concluded on Tuesday 10th November. Our community has been integral in providing feedback via individual or group meetings with parents, teachers and students.

Our focus for the next four years is to continue to:

- Improve the learning of all our students in Numeracy and continuing our improvement in Literacy.
- Create and improve learner agency to create curious and confident learners, who are more independent and self-aware.
- Strengthen the social and emotional wellbeing of every student.

I would like to thank Ange Ellis (School Council) Michelle Rayner, Alesha Sangster and Kellie McDonald for their time and valuable contributions to this process. I'd like to also thank the staff and parents who provided insightful input and especially to our students who have helped shape our next four years. Overall our review was a positive reflection of our work over the last four years.

We are still in deliberation, discussion and investigation of the best possible combination of grades for your children and teacher placement for 2021. Staff are now working on class lists ready for Step Up Day on Tuesday 8th December. We will continue this process for all students who are currently attending our school in year Prep to 5. At this stage, our new Preps 2021 will attend as groups of 10 as per the current guidelines and we are yet to hear the process for our Year 6 students. We will inform parents as soon as we have received further advice.

Our Step-up day runs for the first 2 hours of the day (9.00am to 11.00 am). This is when the students all step up to meet their new teacher for the following year and who will be in their class for 2021. It is an exciting day and a lot of preparation will have gone into finalising and coordinating grade placement. This involves looking at children's needs and making the best possible educational plans for all students in our school. When placing students in class groups, we will be mindful of addressing this along with consideration of who your child learns best with, their ability, behaviour and social needs.

A reminder for Term 4 commencement of Term 1 2021

We are identified as being at higher risk on the Bushfire register and, as such, will be required to preemptively close on days of Code Red Day fire danger. More information will be available next year.

On days of Total fire ban all children will be required to be picked up from drop off and no children will be permitted to walk home or leave the school without an adult.

As part of continuing Emergency Management arrangements for roll marking after the children have come in from lunch will occur. In the event of an unforeseen fire we would waste several precious moments trying to work out where children are if they have not been signed out. I can only implore you to make sure you follow this very simple procedure.

It is important that all parents have alternative arrangements in place for these days. Also as these days occur and you choose to pick your child up early it is an absolute must to sign your children out at the office.

A few bits to share from Michelle....


