IMPORTANT NEWS FROM OSHC

Dear Families,

Our Program is expected to be self-funding so we rely on the payment of your fees for keeping attendance cost down and the continuance of the program.

Thank you to all the parents who pay their accounts promptly. Accounts are issued fortnightly and are expected to be paid within 7 days (as stated on Enrolment form) unless a payment plan has been arranged. Arrangements can be made for your Credit Card account to be debited fortnightly. School Council also reserves the right to refuse care where accounts remain unpaid.

Term 4 will see the introduction of \$20 late fee if accounts are not paid within 14 days of issue (unless prior arrangements are made).

We also offer a wonderful OSHC program invoiced fortnightly. Congratulations to The Patch Primary School – finalist in the Premier's Sustainability Awards 2013

The Patch Primary School has been named as a finalist in the Premier's Sustainability Awards for their Learning Landscape program which aims to produce responsible, informed and proactive young citizens.

Sustainability Victoria CEO, Stan Krpan, congratulated The Patch Primary School for their innovative project and said they were an excellent example of leadership in sustainability.

"Their work has been recognised by the awards judges in the Education category for their outstanding contribution to sustainability. The vision and innovation shown by all finalists is what makes Victoria an international leader in sustainability," he said.

The school's Learning Landscape is an outdoor environmental education program which incorporates experiential, participatory and multidisciplinary approaches to engage students and build understanding, knowledge, responsibility and sustainability leadership.

Built over ten years, the program has won multiple awards for its gardens and grounds, designed and created by the students and community, and also received awards for teaching practice and curriculum innovation that integrates academic learning with practical skills.

Using observation, enquiry and investigation, and with collaboration from external partners, including scientists and practitioners, students are able to make connections to the world around them and become passionate, articulate and independent learners.

Now in their 11th year, the Premier's Sustainability Awards celebrate efficient use of water, resources and energy, better waste management and recycling practices, the enhancement of the environment and effective, practical community action.

Finalists have been chosen in seven categories: *Innovative Products or Services, Infrastructure and Buildings, Education, Environmental Protection, Small and Medium Enterprises, Large Business* and *Community.* Winners will be selected from each category.

In addition to these awards, the Premier will personally select two overall winners: the Premier's Recognition Award and the Premier's Regional Recognition Award.

The Premier's Regional Recognition Award will focus on a regional finalist who has demonstrated significant benefit for regional Victoria.

The overall winner will receive the Premier's Recognition Award, which focuses on exemplary leadership and innovation in sustainability. All award winners, whether regional or metropolitan will be eligible for the Premier's Recognition Award.

Winners will be announced at the awards night on **Tuesday 22 October**, at Peninsula A, Shed 14 Central Pier, 161 Harbour Esplanade, Docklands. Tickets are now available for purchase **and will close on Monday 14 October**.

In acknowledgement of our school's environmental program, innovative curriculum, sustainability practices, student action and active community, we have been selected as one of three finalists in the Education Category. It is an extraordinary achievement and a credit to the ongoing commitment, dedication and drive of our whole school community. And it doesn't stop there!

The Patch Primary School has been invited to attend and present at a UNESCO conference in Japan in October along with two sustainability officers from the Yarra Ranges Council (YRC) to share our sustainability and environmental journey with a broader audience and to highlight the features that make our partnership with the Yarra Ranges Council such a successful one. The invitation comes from a project The Patch Primary School (TPPS) participated in with RMIT a few years ago which investigated what makes a sustainable and successful school/community partnership. The findings from this research project shall be shared in Japan with delegates from the Asis-Pacific Region (Bangladesh, Thailand, Indonesia, Japan and Cambodia).

I shall be presenting TPPS story alongside Simon Woodland and Anthony Mann from YRC and while there shall be carrying out some preliminary investigations into the possibility of a sister school in Japan to expand and enrich our Japanese program.

It is an exciting prospect to be invited to such an event and we hope to inspire others and generate some interesting discussion around successful school/community partnerships.

Still More!

Last week we received news that we were successful in obtaining a \$10,000 grant from Sustainability Victoria and the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development to improve our school's energy efficiency. This will enable us to undertake a thorough energy audit and retro fit some of our buildings with more sustainable features to reduce our energy use and bills. We may also be able to investigate some renewable energy options to enrich our students' learning and further improve our sustainability practices.

Kids Teaching Kids Day at Gembrook Primary School

On Friday, September 13, ten students from Year 5 and Pauleen Gould and myself, went to Gembrook Primary School to participate in the 2013 Kids Teaching Kids Day. This day recognises the profound teaching and learning opportunities when students take responsibility for delivering instruction to their peers and promotes leadership, teamwork and interpersonal development.

The focus of KTK day is to broaden the knowledge and understanding of local environmental issues and identify actions students can take to address some of them.

The year five students who presented are part of our EarthKeepers Team and, with the help of our bearded dragons and blue tongue lizards, they shared some insights and procedures around keeping wildlife in schools. These workshops identified the issue of habitat destruction and how improved knowledge of animal needs and nature connections can have a positive impact on how we value and manage our natural landscape.

Throughout the day, our students were presented with ideas, information, resources and entertainment to broaden their knowledge and identify new projects and initiatives to bring back and incorporate at The Patch PS. These include opportunities to participate in a Parks Victoria programme called Forest Classroom, a free five day nature immersion program based in Ferntree Gully National Park which explores themes such as mapping, flora and fauna, Kokoda trail, park management and more. Another initiative uses student weather monitors to identify the main weather patterns of the day and to inform students of weather forecasts to ensure appropriate clothing is worn the following day. Our weather monitors will be writing something for the newsletter next term.

KTK Day is an empowering and inspiring event and we are very pleased to have been able to attend. A big thank you goes to Pauleen Gould for helping to transport our students to and from Gembrook PS and for assisting in organising and overseeing the day.

Scarlet Fever

This week we have had a case of scarlet fever reported in the Grade 3 & 4 area.

Scarlet fever is a symptom of a streptococcal infection with its own symptoms including:

- Inflammation of the throat.
- A pink-red rash spreading across the abdomen, side of the chest and in the skin folds. The rash may feel like sandpaper when touched.
- A bright red tongue (known as strawberry tongue').
- Paleness around the mouth.

If your child shows any of these symptoms we suggest that you seek medical advice.
