The first weeks of Year 3 and 4 are sometimes difficult ones for students. They have transitioned from the Early Years classroom and are faced with greater expectations and challenges. The role of the Year 3/4 teacher is to encourage and support independent work habits and the appreciation of school procedures and rules. Students are encouraged to solve age appropriate problems by themselves and understand the need for consequences for unacceptable behaviour. If your child is experiencing difficulties with this transition, you can help by:

- Reinforcing positive behaviour with praise and small rewards
- Raising expectations in terms of self-care, i.e. packing school bags, making lunches, bringing diaries to school
- Understanding that learning is sometimes difficult and persistence is required to succeed
- Encouraging your child to recognise their role in solving relationship issues.

#### What we are learning...

#### Literacy

So far this year we have been working on our Writer's Notebook, writing stories, then editing, revising and sometimes even publishing them. In reading we have been using sticky notes to track our thinking and write questions and connections. We had a spelling test last be having a spelling test this week and our spelling words will follow soon.

#### **Numeracy**

In numeracy we have been working on place value and counting patterns. We have been playing lots of games and we are working hard on numbers up to the trillions and specifically up to the 100 000's. We are also working on time, Students have added important dates to their diaries. Look at those clocks at home and talk about the time that elapses between our activities.

#### **Integrated Studies**

We have done lots of work on rules and consequences. We have worked out why we need rules and which rules our classes will abide by. We have agreed on fair consequences. We have also looked at our resilience plans and dealing with stress. We have also been participating in lessons from the "Respectful Relationships" program.

#### **STEM**

In STEM we are investigating heat, and the absence of heat - cold. We will do a range of hands-on investigations to explore heat sources, heat transfer and changes of state caused by heat. I encourage students to look for examples of heat in the world around them. – Nina

This Term in P.E we are looking at being healthy and active in our everyday lives. Our main focus is on Athletics, where students will practice running, throwing and jumping events before our Senior Athletics Carnival on the 19th of March. #### Philosphy:

#### **Japanese**

Minasan Konnichiwa! Hello everyone!

This term in grade 3/4, students are revising Japanese greetings, hiragana, days of the week, weather and number up to 100. For the past two weeks students have been writing their own greeting songs, using correct terms and pronunciation. We will be introducing "hiragana karate" over the next few weeks, where students will focus in 10 hiragana characters at a time, as a means to earn their next karate belt. We will also work on self-introductions including name, age, school and family members. ### Art

To begin Art this year across the whole school we have been exploring 'belonging', what it looks like, feels like and sounds like.

Students shared and discussed what belonging means to them such as being accepted for who you are, having gratitude in your life, family and friends, community, cultural foods, having faith and hope. The most consistent feedback seemed to be the students' connection to nature.

Students participated in a creative visualisation, whereby they flew in a cloud to the place where they feel they truly belong and feel free to be their true selves. Students were given the opportunity to explore and express their personal Nature Connections through:

- Sharing past experiences
- Reflecting on their feelings and emotions
- Re-creating their favourite places through drawing

Students sat independently in a favourite place in the school grounds and expressed how the environment influenced and supported their ability to identify how they feel within themselves and their ability to learn. Students coloured in feather designs outside in nature, choosing colours that reflect how being in that space made them feel and then added words to describe their feelings.

There will be a display in the main building of all the students of The Patch Primary Schools feathers making a beautiful set of wings.

Next in Art students will be exploring a unit on threads and textiles. Grade 3's will be creating a recorder bag to be used in music sessions with Leanne out of hessian and wool. Grade 4's will be scrap quilting to create four sports house banners to be used at school athletics days or any school sporting events. Our school house colours are named after the Wurundjeri colour names, which are Merwool - yellow, Namin - blue, Yetta - green, Jalwick - red. Any parents with skills who are interested in assisting please let me know.

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# **Terracycle Update:**

Our school is currently involved in three Terracycle programs:

# 1) Colgate oral care products

Any brand of toothbrushes, empty toothpaste tubes, floss containers, electric toothbrush heads.

Please note - bamboo tooth brushes should not be included in the program. With these, remove the bristles at home (place in landfill) and then reuse or compost the stick

#### 2) Bread bag tags

As the name says, hard plastic bag clips, as you would normally find on a bread bag or similar. No twist ties.

#### 3) Dish and air care products:

Any brand of dish care and air care packaging, including:

- Dishwashing liquid bottles (including caps)
- Dishwashing tablets flexible packaging (including snap locks and zip locks)
- Air freshener aerosol cans and spray bottles (including spray and trigger heads)
- Plug-in air fresheners and refills (including plastic outer packaging)
- Clip-on car fresheners and refills (including plastic outer packaging)

The **Terracycle collection bins are located** near the library entrance, near Tania's prep classroom. Please place bag tags inside the plastic bag in the labelled bin.



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
