PatchFest News...

Last week our PatchFest Committee met via WebEx to discuss whether or not we continue to hold PatchFest in October.

With the **risk of a snap lockdown** preventing the event from going ahead, we decided that it was **too risky this year**.

We are mindful of the increased stress levels associated with the **additional demands** around being CovidSafe, preparing stalls, volunteers and activities, seeking donations from already stretched businesses, and the risk of expending funds that cannot be redeemed if the event does not go ahead.

This resulted in the decision to postpone the event until October, 2022.

However, all is not lost, as **<u>next October our school celebrates its 40th birthday</u>** which would fit in nicely with the celebrations we plan.

We are still able to continue with a couple of the fundraising initiatives without PatchFest, such as a **T-Towel Fundraiser** which will be promoted shortly.

We are also scheduling an end of year **celebrations evening on the oval**, **incorporating some Christmas carols** and student performances.

At this stage, we have pencilled in Wednesday, December 8 from 4pm.

The evening will incorporate a picnic on the oval with some food stalls, our wonderful plant stall that would have been featured at PatchFest, a coffee van and performances including the year 6 mask parade.

It would be over by 8pm but families could linger longer if they wished. More on this later.

WE WANT OUR PARENTS/CAREGIVERS/GUARDIANS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents/caregivers/guardians think of our school.

The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents/caregivers/guardians (previously known as the Parent Opinion Survey).

It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, student engagement and experiences of remote and flexible learning. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Approximately 30 per cent of parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year, the Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 19**th **July** to **Sunday 22**nd **August.**

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones.

The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (Hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.
